

IMMANUEL CHURCH

was built in the neo-gothic style by German settlers and inaugurated in 1904. Since 1955 the Norwegian Church Ministry to Israel has been in charge of the building. In 1977 Paul Ott from Göttingen, Germany crafted the organ, and the interior of the church was renovated.

THE STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

were made in 1977 by the Norwegian artist, Victor Sparre. He used the La Dalle technique where two cm. thick colored glass pieces are beaten into suitable shapes with a hammer and then joined together with reinforced concrete.

A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF THE MAIN WINDOWS



Left The glad tidings of the birth of Jesus with the child in a simple crib (Luke 2).



Middle A symbol of God's love. A hand from heaven, centered in a heart, is reaching down to mankind and below comes a drop of blood with a crown of thorns inside – in the form of the Star of David.

He, who bore the crown of thorns for all humanity, was born within the chosen people of Israel, since it was through this people God would bless all the peoples of the earth (Genesis 12 / Galatians 3).



This window envisages the New Jerusalem coming down from heaven with twelve towers and gates, representing the 12 tribes of Israel and the 12 disciples of Jesus (Isaiah 65:17-19 / Revelation 21).



The rose window, to the west depicts a lit Menorah with the hands of God keeping His people forever.



To the south, opposite the organ
This shows Peter's awakening of Tabitha from Jaffa (Acts 9).

Middle The vision of Peter is portrayed as it is described in Acts 10. Through this revelation Peter saw that in his Son, Jesus Christ, God has destroyed any wall of partition and calls a people to himself of Jews and Gentiles alike (Ephesians 2).



The Jewish apostle Peter baptizing the Gentile Roman centurion Cornelius in Caesarea started the outreach of the gospel to non-Jews.

These windows show the prophet Jonah, who fled God's calling by boarding a ship in Jaffa.

Left Jonah is inside the fish – praying and repenting of his disobedience.



ight Jonah sitting outside Nineveh under a tree, which God let die to show Jonah that it was less important than all the people he spared.
